CHAINS	
20.20	Fence corner, from which fences bear ENE., WNW. and S.; enter nearly level meadow land.
24.60	Wash, 20 lks. wide, 10 ft. deep, drains NE.
24.80	Power line, bears NE. and SW.
34.00	Fence, bears E. and W.; leave meadow, enter sagebrush and bunchgrass.
40.40	The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 6, monumented with a granite stone, 12x10x6 ins., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ on the W. face and firmly set in a mound of stone.
	At the corner point
	Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
	T34N R39E R40E $\frac{1}{4}$ S 1   S 6 1971
	bury the original corner stone alongside the iron post and raise a mound of stone 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high, W. of cor.

16.00	Fence, bears E. and W.
20.00	Rock Creek, 20 lks. wide, 5 ft. deep, 6 ins. water, course E.
39.88	The cor. of Tps. 34 and 35 N., Rs. 39 and 40 E., monumented with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., set, mkd., and witnessed as described in the field notes of T. 35 N., R. 39 E., resurveyed concurrently under this same group.
