79.80 Power line, bears ESE. and WNW.

82.22 Intersect the Seventh Standard Parallel North.

The closing cor. of Tps. 35 N., Rs. 39 and 40 E., monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record of the resurvey of the Seventh Standard Parallel North, under Group No. 427, in 1967.

From this corner, the standard cor. of Tps. 36 N., Rs. 39 and 40 E., monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record, bears N. 89° 50' E., 14.04 chs. dist.

From this same corner, the standard ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 36, T. 36 N., R. 39 E., monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record, bears S. 89° 50' W., 26.08 chs. dist.
