From this corner, the standard $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 31, T. 36 N., R. 39 E., monumented with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record, bears N. $89^{\circ} 50'$ E., 13.39 chs. dist.

From this same corner, the standard cor. of Tps. 36 N., Rs. 38 and 39 E., monumented with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record, bears S. $89^{\circ} 50'$ W., 26.65 chs. dist.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 35 North, Range 39 East, varies from about 4,600 ft. to about 9,400 ft. above sea level. The Sonoma Mountain Range runs generally north and south through the township.

The soil consists of sandy loam in the lower elevations to sandy clay and rocky in the higher elevations.

The vegetation on the lower elevations consists of sagebrush while the higher elevations consists mostly of sagebrush, native grasses and with scattered juniper in section 3. There are scattered aspens along the creek bottoms.

The township is drained by the following: Water Canyon drains northwesterly through sections 7, 18 and 19; Harmony Canyon drains northwesterly through sections 5, 6, 8 and 17; Devils Canyon drains northeasterly through sections 1, 2, 10, 11 and 15 and Pole Creek which drains northeasterly through the eastern portion of the township.

Access into the township is provided by numerous trail roads.

Principal users of the township are cattlemen.
