in 1869.

From the cor. of Tps. 37 and 38 N., Rs. 44 and 45 E.,
monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., set, mkd.
and witnessed as described in the field notes of the
1970 resurvey of T. 38 N., R. 45 E.

N. 89° 35' W., bet. secs. 1 and 36.

Over nearly level land, through medium greasewood and
sagebrush.

40.64 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 36, at propor-
tionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the
original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins.
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins.
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
