	<p>From the cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, on the E. bdy. of the Tp., monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of the 1970 resurvey of T. 38 N., R. 45 E.</p> <p>N. 86° 42' W., bet. secs. 25 and 36.</p> <p>Over nearly level land, through medium greasewood and sagebrush.</p>
25.00	Ditch, 20 lks. wide, 1 ft. deep, drains SW.
25.30	Evans Creek, dry, 20 lks. wide, 1 ft. deep, course SW.
41.38	Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 25 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
	Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

40.16	The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 25 and 26, monumented with a steel fence post, extending 4 ft. above the ground, with an unmarked squared wooden post, 2x2x20 ins., attached to the fence post.
	At the corner point
