The land within Township 38 North, Range 44 East, varies from nearly level land in the southern portion to rolling hills in the western portion and steep mountainous terrain in the northeastern portion. The elevation ranges from about 4,600 to 7,600 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from sandy to rocky clay. Portions of secs. 33 and 34 are under cultivation and the remaining area has vegetation consisting of sagebrush, greasewood and native grasses.

The area drains in a southerly direction throughout the township. There are springs located in sec. 12 and a house in sec. 32. No mineral formation of consequence were noted during the survey.

Access to the area is provided by Nevada State Highway No. 18, a graded road and supplemented by numerous trail roads. Principal uses of the area are ranching and farming.
