Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by
Hatch, Eaton and Smyles, U. S. Deputy Surveyors,
in 1872.

Beginning at the standard cor. of Tps. 36 N., Rs. 46 and
47 E., monumented with an iron post, 3 ins. diam., set,
mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record.

N. 0° 05' W., bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Over nearly level land, through medium sagebrush.

27.70 Trail road, bears NE. and SW.

39.90 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, monumented with the
remains of a decayed willow post, 15 ins. long, 1 in.
diam., dim scribe marks visible and loosely set in a
mound of earth.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins.
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

Over nearly level land.

10.50 Improved bladed road, bears ENE. and WSW.

39.97 The cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, monumented with a
squared willow post, 15 ins. long, 2 ins. square, dim
scribe marks visible and loosely set in a mound of earth.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins.
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
