

## DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE SUBDIVISIONAL LINES OF T. 36 N., R. 47 E.

CHAINS

N. 0° 12' E., bet. secs. 5 and 6.

Over rolling land, through medium sagebrush; desc. 30 ft. over N. slope.

9.60 Wash, 10 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, drains W.; asc. 40 ft. over S. slope.

39.04 Point for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 5 and 6, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.Set an iron post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 36 North, Range 47 East ranges from about 4800 to 5200 ft. above sea level, and in nearly level to rolling land. The soil is sandy clay, gravelly and rocky. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, greasewood and crested wheatgrass.

The township is drained by Rock Creek, which winds south through the western portion of the township and Antelope Creek which winds southwesterly through the center of the township.

The Wire Corral Ranch is located in section 15.

No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen. Access into the township is provided by desert roads.
