	GENERAL DESCRIPTION
	<p>The area surveyed is mountainous and ranges from about 5,700 to 7,000 ft. above sea level. The soil ranges from sandy loam in the lower elevations, to extremely rocky in the higher elevations. The vegetation consists mainly of sagebrush and native grasses. The only timber is a few widely scattered juniper trees and scattered patches of aspen. The only water noted was a spring branch in the NE. corner of sec. 36. There was no mining activity noted. Principal use of the area is for grazing.</p>
