Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by
George A. Bellinger, U. S. Deputy Surveyor,
in 1904

The cor. of secs. 25, 26, 35 and 36, monumented with a
basalt stone, 24x10x10 ins., firmly set, mkd. with 1
notch on the S. and E. edges, with a scattered mound of
stone W. of cor.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 6 ins. in
the ground to bedrock and in a mound of stone, 4 ft.
base to top, with brass cap mkd.

bury the original corner alongside the iron post.

N. 0° 06' E., bet. secs. 25 and 26.

Over mountainous land, through scattered sagebrush and
native grass; asc. gradually over SE. slope.

- 8.00 Top of ascent; desc. 70 ft. along E. slope, across top
of wide ridge.
- 16.20 Head of draw, drains E.
- 35.80 South rim of McDonald Creek canyon, bears WNW. and ESE.;
desc. 190 ft. over steep N. slope.
- 39.00 Enter dense aspen, scrub mahogany and wild roses.
- 40.04 The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 25 and 26, monumented with a
basalt stone, 18x10x3 ins., firmly set, mkd. ¼ on the
W. face, with a scattered mound of stone W. of cor.;
there is no remaining evidence of the original aspen
bearing tree.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 18 ins.
in the ground to bedrock and in a mound of stone, 3 ft.
base to top, with brass cap mkd.
