

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE SUBDIVISIONAL LINES,  
T. 47 N., R. 56 E., MDM, NEVADA

CHAINS	<p>3.00 Creek, 3 lks. wide, 1 in. deep, course N., irregularly; asc. 800 ft. over broken SE. slope.</p> <p>37.80 Ridge, bears NE. and SW.; desc. 100 ft. over ledgy NW. slope.</p> <p>40.97 The cor. of secs. 19, 24, 25 and 30, on the W. bdy. of the Tp. (Ruby Valley Guide Meridian), monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of T. 47 N., R. 55 E., concurrently resurveyed under this same group.</p>
<p>GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>The area resurveyed within Township 47 North, Range 56 East is mountainous. The elevation ranges from about 4,900 ft. above sea level along the Bruneau River, to about 6,700 ft. above sea level on the East boundary of the township. The soil ranges from sandy loam along the river bottom to extremely rocky and clayey in the higher elevations. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, shadscale and native grasses throughout the area. The major drainages are covered with dense willows, aspen, wild roses and juniper. There are scattered patches of juniper, pinon and mahogany in the higher elevations.</p> <p>There are numerous meadows situated along the Bruneau River which are used for the production of hay and pasture. The entire area is used extensively for grazing. The Bruneau River supplies water for irrigation of the meadows, and there are numerous springs located within the area.</p> <p>There was no active mining operations noted in the area. The abandoned Bruneau Mine is located in sec. 29, and several other abandoned mine shafts were noted along the Bruneau River.</p>	
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
