Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by
U. S. Deputy Surveyors A. J. Hatch and J. H. Eaton,
in 1869.

The cor. of Tps. 33 and 34 N., Rs. 43 and 44 E., monu-
mented with a redwood post, 36x4x4 ins., scribe marks
visible, firmly set in a mound of earth.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins., diam., 22 ins.
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
