GENERAL DESCRIPTION	
<p>The land within Township 45 North, Range 40 East is rolling and mountainous. The elevation ranges from about 6,500 to 7,400 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from clay loam in the lower elevations to gravelly and rocky in the higher elevations. The timber is composed of scattered mahogany on the higher elevations and scattered willows and aspen along the streams. The vegetation consists of sagebrush and sparse native grasses.</p>	
<p>There are several springs and creeks throughout the township that drain into North Fork Little Humboldt River which crosses the township in a general east direction. The remainder is drained by Martin Creek and Groundhog Creek. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.</p>	
<p>Principal uses of the area are cattle grazing and recreation such as camping, fishing and hunting. Access into the township is provided by gravel roads and trail roads.</p>	
<p>A line cabin is located in section 22 and an abandoned stone cabin is located in section 29.</p>
