Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by
M. F. Reilly and T. A. Magee, U. S. Deputy Surveyors,
in 1881

The cor. of Tps. 2 and 3 N., Rs. 53 and 54 E., monu-
mented with a granite stone, 16x12x10 ins., mkd. with
6 grooves on the N., E., S. and W. faces and firmly set
in a mound of stone.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins.
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

bury the original corner stone alongside the iron post
and raise a mound of stone, 4 ft. base, 3 ft. high,

WEST, bet. secs. 1 and 36.

Over a gradual W. slope, through budsage and shadscale;
desc. 90 ft. to the ¼ sec. cor.

33.00 Enter wash, 30 lks. wide, 1 ft. deep, drains W. from
S. 55° E.

40.24 The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 36, monumented with an
unmarked sandstone, 14x10x5 ins. and firmly set in a
mound of stone, located on the N. edge of a wash. This
is accepted as the best available evidence of the
position of the original corner.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins.
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
