GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 4 North, Range 54 East, ranges from about 4,900 to 5,000 ft. above sea level and is mostly level land. The soil is sandy and vegetation consists of budsage, shadscale and greasewood.

The township is situated in Railroad Valley. Access is provided by numerous secondary and desert trail roads. Drainage throughout the township is in a general northerly direction, except in the northwest portion of the township which drains southeasterly.

The principal users of the township are cattlemen. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.
