The elevation ranges from about 5,700 to 6,000 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from sandy loam along the creek bottom to rocky in the higher elevations. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, bunchgrass and meadow grass along the creek bottom. There are scattered patches of willows along the creek. The North Fork of Salmon Falls Creek flows southerly through the center of sec. 32.</p> <p>A portion of the Twin Meadows Ranch is situated in sec. 32. The principal use of the area is for grazing and the production of hay. No mining activities were noted in the area.</p> <hr/>
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
