Over mountainous land, covered with sagebrush and  
scattered bunchgrass; asc. 10 ft. over E. slope.

- 2.50 Spur, slopes S.; desc. 230 ft. over SW. slope.
- 23.80 Draw, drains SSE.; asc. 60 ft. over NE. slope.
- 27.38 Intersect the California-Nevada State Line.

Point for the closing cor. of Tps. 32 and 32½ N.,  
R. 17 E.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 10 ins.  
in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone,  
5 ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.
