The elevation ranges from about 5,500 to 6,100 ft. above sea level. The soil consists of sandy clay and rocky throughout the township. The vegetation consists of sagebrush and bunchgrass.</p> <p>There are several springs noted and tied to corners throughout the township.</p> <p>Principal users of the area are cattlemen. Access into the township is provided by unimproved roads. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.</p>
