

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE SUBDIVISIONAL LINES,
T. 12 N., R. 21 E., MDM, NEVADA

CHAINS

Township 12 North, Range 21 East is situated about 4 miles east of Gardnerville, Nevada. Land within the township is mountainous in the southeastern portion, rolling to gently rolling in the remainder of the township. The elevation ranges from 5,000 to 7,100 ft. above sea level. The soil consists of sandy clay loam to rocky. The vegetation consists of juniper and pinon in the higher elevations and sagebrush in the lower elevations.

The township is drained by Pine Nut Creek, which flows northwest from the east boundary of section 36 to the west boundary of section 6. U. S. Highway No. 395 crosses the Township through secs. 31 and 32.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen. Access into the township is provided by bladed roads and numerous trail roads.

There are numerous abandoned mines in the township but no mining activity of consequence was noted at the time of survey.
