GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The Northeasterly portion of the Township is located on the Southerly end of the Eugene Mountains. The Humboldt River, located in the Southern portion, flows into Rye Patch Reservoir in the Southwest portion.

The soil consists of a sandy loam in the valleys and loam with rock outcroppings in the mountains.

The vegetation consists of shadscale, budsage and greasewood.

There are a few abandoned mines in the mountains with some prospecting in the Northeast portion of the Township.
