

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE HAMILTON TOWN SITE IN
T. 16 N., R. 58 E., MDM, NEVADA

CHAINS

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 16 North, Range 58 East, ranges from about 7,200 to 9,000 ft. above sea level and is mountainous. The soil is sandy clay, gravelly and rocky. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, buckbrush and native grass. There is scattered juniper, pinon and mahogany throughout the township.

The township is drained by Cottonwood Creek, which winds northerly through the eastern portion of the township and Harris Canyon, which winds easterly through the center of the township and by other minor drainages.

The Hamilton Town Site is situated in secs. 17 and 18 and there are patented mining claims in secs. 7, 17 and 18, although no mining activity was noted during the time of the survey.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen and access into the township is provided by improved and unimproved roads.
