	<p style="text-align: center;">GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>The area surveyed in T. 17 N., R. 58 E., ranges from about 6,800 to 7,600 ft. above sea level and is rolling. The soil is sandy clay, gravelly and rocky. The vegetation consists of sagebrush and bunchgrass. There are scattered juniper, pinon and mahogany.</p> <p>Principal users of the area are cattlemen and access into the township is provided by improved and unimproved roads. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.</p>
