

TOWNSHIP 27 NORTH, RANGE 18 EAST, MDM, NEVADA

CHAINS

The following field notes are those of the retracement of the Nevada-California State Line from Mile Post Nos. 120 to 127, and the dependent resurvey of the north, south and east boundaries and the subdivisional lines of Township 27 North, Range 18 East, Mount Diablo Meridian, Nevada.

The Nevada-California State Line was surveyed by U. S. Astronomer and Surveyor A. W. Von Schmidt in 1872 and retraced by U. S. Deputy Surveyor Milton Santee in 1880. The east boundary was surveyed by U. S. Deputy Surveyor G. W. Garside in 1872 and resurveyed by U. S. Deputy Surveyor Milton Santee in 1880. The north and south boundaries and subdivisional lines were surveyed by U. S. Deputy Surveyor Milton Santee in 1880.

Before restoring the corners, the lines of the original surveys were retraced and diligent search made for any evidence of the original corners and other calls of the original field note record.

The rules of proportionate measurement were applied in order to ascertain the position of lost corners, after completing the necessary retracements to connect with the identified corner location. In order to simplify the record, the true line notes only are supplied herewith which refer to the completed survey.

The directions of the lines of this survey were determined by azimuth taken from U.S.C. & G.S. triangulation station "HIGH ROCK," and were carried forward throughout the township by sustained angulation. The vertical angles of measurements made on the slope were ascertained by a clinometer in good adjustment; the horizontal equivalents only are entered in the field notes.

The survey was executed in accordance with the specifications as set forth in the Manual of Surveying Instructions, 1947, and the Special Instructions dated August 20, 1973.

The geographic position for the southeast corner of the township is at latitude 40° 09' 31.4" N., and longitude 119° 54' 07.8" W., as calculated from U.S.C. & G.S. triangulation station "HIGH ROCK," located in sec. 36, T. 28 N., R. 17 E., California.

The mean magnetic declination was found to be 17° east.
