	<p>Over nearly level land, covered with medium greasewood.</p>
60.51	<p>The closing corner of Tps. 26 and 27 N., R. 18 E., hereinafter described.</p>
80.30	<p>Point for Mile Post No. 127, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner. NOT MONUMENTED.</p>
	<p>From which, Mile Post No. 128, bears S. 0° 07' W., 80.05 chs. dist., monumented with a squared wooden post, 4 ins. square, 5 ft. long, firmly set 2 ft. in a mound of earth, mkd. with NEV on the E. face, CAL on the W. face, 128 on the N. face and 1872 L120 on the S. face.</p>

	<p>Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</p>

(Record stone). This is accepted as the best existing evidence of the position of the original corner.</p>
