CHAINS

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

deposit the original wooden post, broken glass and set a steel fence post, 6 ft. long, 22 ins. in the ground, alongside the iron post.

S. 89° 53' W., beginning new measurement.

Over nearly level land.

34.65 Intersect the Nevada-California State Line.

The closing corner of Tps. 26 and 27 N., R. 18 E., monumented with a squared wooden post, 4 ins. square, 3 ft. long, firmly set 12 ins. in the ground, with illegible scribe marks visible.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
