Mile Post No. 119, monumented with a basalt stone,  $16 \times 10 \times 8$  ins., firmly set in a mound of stone, mkd. with NEV on the E. face, CAL on the W. face, O 119 M on the N. face and 1872 L120 on the S. face.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 12 ins. in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone, 5 ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.

MP 119 CAL NEV

deposit the original cornerstone and set a steel fence post, 6 ft. long, 12 ins. in the ground, alongside the iron post.

S. 0° 18' W., along the 120th mile.

Over rolling land, covered with medium sagebrush and greasewood.

- 5.00 Wash, 30 lks. wide, 4 ft. deep, drains WSW.; desc. 210 ft. over S. slope to Mile Post No. 120.
- 61.24 The closing corner of secs. 29 and 32, T. 28 N., R. 18 E., hereinafter described.
- 71.00 Wash, 50 lks. wide, 3 ft. deep, drains SSW.
- 79.94 Mile Post No. 120, monumented with a granite stone, 20x20x20 ins., firmly set in a mound of stone, mkd. with NEV on the E. face, CAL on the W. face, ML20 on the N. face and 1872 LL20 on the S. face.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
