

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE SUBDIVISIONAL LINES,
T. 30 N., R. 18 E., MDM, NEVADA

CHAINS	<p>Ascend 40 ft. over broken S. slope.</p> <p>66.70 Wash, 20 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, drains SE.; asc. 40 ft. over N. slope.</p> <p>72.48 Intersect the Nevada-California State Line.</p> <p>The closing corner of secs. 29 and 32, T. 30 N., R. 18 E., monumented with a mound of stone, no marked stone found. This position is accepted as the best existing evidence of the position of the original corner.</p> <p>At the corner point</p> <p>Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 6 ins. in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone, 4 ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.</p> <div><div>T30N R18E S 29 S 32</div>CC</div> <p>1973</p> <p>set a steel fence post, 6 ft. long, 6 ins. in the ground, alongside the iron post.</p> <p>From this corner, Mile Post No. 107, on the Nevada-California State Line, bears N. 0° 05' W., 35.81 chs. dist.</p>
	<p>GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>The area resurveyed within Township 30 North, Range 18 East, varies from mountainous to rolling land. The elevation ranges from about 5,100 to 6,300 ft. above sea level. The soil consists of sandy clay loam and is rocky. The vegetation consists of sagebrush and bunchgrass.</p> <p>Principal users of the area are cattlemen. Access into the township is provided by numerous trail roads.</p> <p>No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.</p>
