<p>CHAINS 39.67</p>	<p>The <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> sec. cor. of secs. 2 and 3, monumented with the original quartzite stone, 19x8x8 ins., dimly mkd. <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> on the W. face, firmly set in a mound of stone. <p>GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p>	
<p>The area surveyed within Township 13 North, Range 69 East, ranges from about 5,800 to 6,800 ft. above sea level and is rolling. The soil is sandy, gravelly and rocky loam, covered with sagebrush and scattered juniper and pinon.</p> <p>Lehman Creek enters the area surveyed in section 11 and flows in an easterly direction through sections 11 and 12.</p> <p>State Highway No. 74 enters the area surveyed in section 12 and leaves in section 11. Further access in the area is provided by gravel, bladed and trail roads.</p> <p>The principal users of the area are farmers.</p> <p>No mineral formation of consequences were noted during the survey.</p>
