The cor. of Tps. 13 and 14 N., Rs. 69 and 70 E., monumented with an iron post, 3 ins. diam., firmly set, exposed 8 ins. above ground, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record of the 1921 resurvey of a portion of the S. bdy. of T. 14 N., R. 69 E., under Group No. 95.

N. 0° 33' E., bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Over rolling E. slope, through greasewood and shadscale.

- 0.70 Wash, 20 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, drains ENE.
3.40 Wash, 30 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, drains E.
5.00 Trail road, bears E. and W.
11.10 Trail road, bears NE. and SW.
13.10 Wash, 20 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, drains E.
16.40 Wash, 20 lks. wide, 1 ft. deep, drains E.
34.90 Wash, 30 lks. wide, 1 ft. deep, drains ENE.
38.50 Bladed road, bears NE. and SW.
39.79 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, monumented with the original quartzite stone, 12x10x10 ins., dimly mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ on the W. face and firmly set in a mound of stone.
- At the corner point
- Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
