

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE SUBDIVISIONAL LINES,
T. 24 N., R. 54 E., MDM, NEVADA

CHAINS	GENERAL DESCRIPTION
	<p>The area resurveyed within Township 24 North, Range 54 East, ranges from about 5,800 to 7,000 ft. above sea level. The eastern portion is located on the foothills of the Diamond Mountains and the remainder is located in Diamond Valley. The soil consists of alkali and sandy loam in the lower elevations and gravelly in the higher elevations. Vegetation consists of greasewood, rabbit-brush, sagebrush and shadscale. There are scattered juniper and pinon on the higher elevations of little commercial value.</p> <p>Abandoned buildings are located in sections 4 and 34. There are artesian wells and springs located throughout the township, ties to which are given in the field notes.</p> <p>No mineral formations of consequence were noted.</p> <p>Principal users of the area are cattlemen. A gravel road crosses the area from south to north.</p>
