T13N R22E ¼ S30 66 FT RM 1973, and an arrow pointing to the cor. tree.</p> <p>An iron post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set, protruding 2 ins. above the ground, bears S. 63° W., 100 lks. dist., with brass cap mkd. T13N R21E ¼ S25 66 FT RM 1973, and an arrow pointing to the cor. tree.</p> <p>N. 89° 40' W., on the E. and W. center line of sec. 25.</p> <p>Over gently rolling hills, through scattering pinon, juniper, and sagebrush.</p> <p>The center ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 25.</p> <p>Dirt road, 15 lks. wide, bears South and N. 20° W., on a curve.</p> <p>Dirt road, 15 lks. wide, bears S. 10° E. and N. 40° W., on a curve.</p> <p>The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 25 and 26, monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set, in a collar of stone, 2 ft. diam., to top, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the Hochstrasser 1973 resurvey.</p>
	<p style="text-align: center;">GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>The land encompassed in this survey is located approximately ten miles northeast of the town of Gardnerville in Douglas County, Nevada. Access is by way of several unimproved dirt roads--one being at the north end of Gardnerville, extending northerly, and another extending easterly from U.S. Highway No. 395 at a point approximately seven miles northwest of Gardnerville.</p> <p>The area drains southwest and northwest into the Carson Valley. Elevations range from about 5,197 ft. above sea level in the NW¼ of section 8, to about 5,960 ft. above sea level at the ¼ section corner of sections 25 and 36.</p> <p>The soil is composed generally of sand and rock. There are scattering stands of pinon pine and juniper. Vegetation consists mainly of sagebrush.</p> <p>The area, being mainly within the boundaries of the Pine Nut Indian Reservation, has no mining exploration in progress.</p>
