

TOWNSHIP 26 NORTH, RANGE 68 EAST, MDM, NEVADA

CHAINS

Mineral Survey No. 1925 was surveyed by Henry Fitzhugh, U.S. Deputy Mineral Surveyor, in 1900.

Before restoring the corners, the lines of the original surveys were retraced and diligent search made for any evidence of the original corners and other calls of the original field note record.

The rules of proportionate measurement were applied in order to ascertain the position of lost corners, after completing the necessary retracements to connect with the identified corner locations. Lines connecting previously established corners were run by the random and true method. In order to simplify the record, the true line notes are supplied herewith which refer to the completed resurveys.

The survey was executed in accordance with the specifications as set forth in the Manual of Surveying Instructions, 1973, and the Special Instructions dated July 15, 1974.

The vertical angles of measurements made on the slope were ascertained by a clinometer in good adjustment; the horizontal equivalents only are entered in the field notes.

The directions of the lines of the survey were determined from sustained angulation to and through the survey from the U.S.C. & G.S. triangulation station "ANTELOPE."

The geographic position for the southeast corner of the township is at latitude $40^{\circ} 04' 23.624''$ N. and longitude $114^{\circ} 14' 18.102''$ W., as published for station "WPA 043L" of the Nevada Planning Division of the Nevada Highway Department, identical with this corner.

The magnetic declination was read at a number of stations throughout the township and the average of these readings was found to be 17° east.

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE EAST BOUNDARY,
T. 26 N., R. 67 E., MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, NEVADA

Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by

From the standard cor. of T. 26 N., Rs. 67 and 68 E., identical with the Nevada Planning Division of the Nevada Highway Department station, WPA 041L, monumented with an iron post, 3 ins. diam., exposed 10 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of the Fifth Standard Parallel North, through R. 67 E., and a portion of R. 68 E., surveyed under Group No. 102, in 1922.
