<p>The original standard corner monuments found on this line are described herein and will now serve as Amended Monuments. The standard corners found on the S. bdy. of sec. 31 are described herein and will now serve as Angle Points.</p>	
<p>The standard corners are established at intervals of 40 chs. from the standard corner of Tps. 26 N., Rs. 68 and 69 E.</p>
