RETRACEMENT AND REMONUMENTATION OF A PORTION OF MINERAL SURVEY NOS. 1722 AND 1922, T. 26 N., R. 68 E., MDM, NEVADA CHAINS GENERAL DESCRIPTION The land within Township 26 North, Range 68 East, ranges from about 5,800 to 7,700 ft. above sea level, and is nearly level to mountainous. The Kingsley Range of Mountains extend south into the northwest portion of the township. The remainder of the township is in Antelope Valley. The soil is sandy clay, gravelly and rocky. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, greasewood, whitesage and native bunchgrass in the valley to juniper, pinon and mountain mahogany in the mountains. The township is drained by minor dry washes draining east and west into the center of the valley. There are mineral surveys in sections 7, 18, and 19. Principal users of the area are cattlemen. Access into the township is provided by numerous desert and trail roads throughout the township.
