A diligent search was made for the original corners and none were found.</p><p>From the cor. of Tps. 26 and 27 N., Rs. 68 and 69 E., monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., exposed 10 ins. above ground and in a collar of stone to cap, 3 ft. base, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the independent resurvey of the west boundary of T. 26 N., R. 69 E., surveyed under Group No. 463.</p></div>
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
