	<p style="text-align: center;">GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>The land within Township 27 North, Range 68 East, ranges from about 5,800 to 7,700 ft. above sea level, and is nearly level to mountainous. The Kingsley Range of Mountains extend into the southwest portion of the township. The remainder of the township is in Antelope Valley. The soil is sandy clay, gravelly and rocky. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, greasewood, whitesage and native bunchgrass in the valley to juniper and pinon in the mountains.</p> <p>The township is drained by minor dry washes draining east and west into the center of the valley.</p> <p>No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.</p> <p>Principal users of the area are cattlemen. Access into the township is provided by numerous desert and trail roads throughout the township.</p>
