CHAINS

From this corner, the cor. of Tps. 28 and 29 N., R. 67 E. bears N. $0^{\circ} 49'$ E., 13.22 chs. dist.

Land, nearly level.

Soil, sandy clay.

Undergrowth, sagebrush, whitesage and greasewood.

INDEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE SUBDIVISIONAL LINES,
T. 28 N., R. 68 E., MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, NEVADA

This Independent Resurvey Supersedes the Survey Executed by Preble and Thorburn, U.S. Deputy Surveyors, in 1882. A diligent search was made for the original corners and none were found.

From the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, on the S. bdy. of the Tp., monumented with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set and exposed 4 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the independent resurvey of the N. bdy. of T. 27 N., R. 68 E., surveyed concurrently under this same group.

N. $0^{\circ} 01'$ W., bet. secs. 35 and 36.

Over rolling land, through medium timber and undergrowth; asc. 120 ft. over SE. slope to the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

23.20 Trail road, bears NNW. and SSE.

31.00 Trail road, bears NE. and SW.

40.00 Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 35 and 36.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

A juniper, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 22° W., 31 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S35 BT.

Ascend 190 ft. over SE. slope.
