	<p>Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by George W. Garside, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, in 1873.</p> <hr/> <p>The cor. of Tps. 33 and 34 N., R. 23 E., and Tps. 33½ and 34 N., R. 24 E., monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set, exposed 6 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of T. 33 N., R. 23 E., resurveyed concurrently under this same group.</p> <p>N. 1° 34' E., bet. secs. 31 and 36.</p> <p>Over nearly level land, through medium greasewood and sagebrush.</p>
24.90	Fence, bears N. 37° W. and S. 37° E.
41.58	<p>Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.</p> <p>Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">T34N R23E R24E ¼ S 36 S 31 1974</p>
79.20	<p>raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, W. of cor.</p> <p>Seep spring, 3 chs. by 1 ch.; long side bears E. and W.</p>
83.16	<p>The cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, monumented with the original squared wooden post, 14 ins. long, 2 ins. square, wired to a steel fence post, exposed 3½ ft. above ground, with illegible scribe marks visible.</p> <p>At the corner point</p> <p>Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">T34N R23E R24E S 25 S 30 S 36 S 31 1974</p> <p>reset the wooden post and set the steel fence post, 5½ ft. long, 24 ins. in the ground, alongside the iron post and raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, W. of cor.</p>
