

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE SUBDIVISIONAL LINES,
T. 34 N., R. 23 E., MDM, NEVADA

	<p>GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>The land resurveyed in Township 34 North, Range 23 East, ranges from about 4,000 to 4,400 ft. above sea level, and is mostly nearly level except for rolling land along the west boundary of the second range of sections. The soil varies from alkali to sandy clay loam with rocks along the western part of the second range of sections. The vegetation consists of greasewood, sagebrush and native grasses. There are sparse willow thickets around some springs.</p> <p>There are ranches in sections 1, 14 and 35. Artesian wells are located in sections 13 and 14 along with many small lakes in sections 1, 2, 11 and 12. Section 2 has a shallow reservoir, formed by an earth fill dam, a hot water geyser, and a cone. A dry lake bed is located in parts of sections 12, 13, 24 and 25.</p> <p>Principal users of the area are cattlemen with the possibility of geothermal development in the north end of the resurveyed part of the township. Access is provided by Nevada State Highway No. 34, an improved gravel road, which enters section 25 going in a westerly direction, then changing to a northerly direction in section 26, and continuing thusly until it exits in section 2. There are also several trail roads connecting to Nevada State Highway No. 34. No mining activity or mineral formations of any consequence were noted during the survey.</p>
