and greasewood; along W. side of fence, fence angles  
to E.

40.45 The  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, monumented with a  
basalt stone, 16x16x10 ins., firmly set 12 ins. in the  
ground, mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  on W. face.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 24 ins.  
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
