

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE SUBDIVISIONAL LINES,
T. 20 N., R. 26 E., MDM, NEVADA

CHAINS

From this corner, the standard $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 31, T. 21 N., R. 26 E., bears N. $89^{\circ} 55'$ E., 11.23 chs. dist., monumented with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set showing 6 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. and witnessed as described in the field note record of the dependent resurvey of T. 21 N., R. 26 E., resurveyed concurrently under this same group.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 20 North, Range 26 East, ranges from about 4,000 to 4,800 ft. above sea level and is mostly level to rolling in the northwest. The soil is a sandy loam in the southern portion while the northern of the township is rocky.

The town of Hazin lies in section 27. The Southern Pacific Railroad enters the township in section 24 and leaves the township in section 18. U.S. Highway No. 95-A enters the township in section 36, leaving in sec. 19.

Principal users of the area are farmers south of the Highway with the remainder of the area almost worthless. At the time of the survey there was no mining activity in the township.
