GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 41 North, Range 43 East, ranges from about 4,600 to 5,000 ft. above sea level, and is nearly level, rolling and mountainous. The soil is sandy clay, gravelly and rocky. The vegetation consists of sagebrush and native grass.

The township is drained by South Fork Little Humboldt River, which winds southwest through the center of the township; North Fork Little Humboldt River which winds southwest through the northwest portion of the township, and by other minor drainages.

No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen. Access into the township is provided by an improved gravel road southeast of the South Fork Little Humboldt River, and by other desert and trail roads; including the North Fork Road.
