CHAINS

3.20 chs. dist. This monument was established on line between Lovelock City Monuments Nos. 6 and 7 by Robert G. Leighton in 1960, and is shown on the plat of survey for the Pershing Hospital, hereinbefore described.

From the center S. SE. 1/64 sec. cor. of sec. 27.

N. 89° 57' W., on a projection of the chain link fence line on the southerly boundary of the Sierra Pacific Power Company's property, hereinbefore described. This line is locally recognized as the E. and W. center line of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 27.

Over nearly level land through grass.

- 0.20 Gravelled road, 25 lks. wide, bears N. and S.
- 0.46 Cor. of chain link fences, 6 ft. high, extending N. and W.; continue along chain link fence.
- 3.10 Cor. of chain link fence and barbed wire fence, 5 strand: chain link fence extends N. and E., barbed wire fence extends W. Continue along barbed wire fence.
- 19.97 The center S. S. 1/64 sec. cor. of sec. 27.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within this survey is nearly level. The elevation is about 4,000 ft. above sea level. The soil is sandy loam.

The survey area is bounded on the north and east by the City of Lovelock, Nevada, and on the south and west by private cattle grazing land.

The average of a number of readings along the lines surveyed indicates a mean magnetic declination of 18° E. with no noticeable difference due to local attraction.
