CHAINS

The following field notes are those of the subdivision of sections 29 and 32, T. 36 N., R. 38 E., Mount Diablo Meridian, Nevada.

The history of the previous surveys for the area of this survey is as follows:

This survey was executed at the request of the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Phoenix Area Office, to delineate the boundaries of the Winnemucca Indian Colony. The Colony's land in the east half of section 32 was reserved by Executive Orders dated June 18, 1917 and February 8, 1918. The Colony's land in the $N\frac{1}{2}NE\frac{1}{4}SW\frac{1}{4}$ of section 29 was purchased September 10, 1928, Warranty Deed No. 1911-F, in the name of the United States of America.

The survey was executed in accordance with the specifications as set forth in the Manual of Surveying Instructions, 1973, and the Special Instructions for Group No. 520, Nevada, dated April 15, 1975.

The direction of the lines of this survey was determined by altitude observations on the sun and carried forward by sustained angulation being supplemented by other altitude observations taken throughout the progress of the survey. All distances were measured with a Keuffel and Esser Micro Ranger, Serial No. 08B10008. All lines not forming a closure were measured several times to preclude error.

The geographic position of the standard $\frac{1}{4}$ section corner of section 32, as determined by a tie to the U.S. Coast and Geodetic Survey triangulation station "HUMBOLDT SOUTH BASE", which is identical with the corner of sections 28, 29, 32, and 33, is:

Latitude: $40^{\circ} 56' 43.3''$ N. Longitude: $117^{\circ} 43' 28.1''$ W.

The mean magnetic declination is 18° E.

Subdivision of Section 29,
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Prior to the subdivision of secs. 29 and 32, the $E\frac{1}{2}$ of the N. and S. bdrs. and the E. bdy. of sec. 32 were retraced. The results of the retracement were in agreement with the record bearings and distances of the 1965 resurvey executed by James R. Munson. Therefore the retracement data is not made a part of these field notes.

From the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 29 and 32, monumented with an iron post, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set, protruding 8 ins.
