GENERAL DESCRIPTION	
<p>The area of this survey is situated adjacent to the City of Winnemucca, Nevada. The land is nearly level to gently rolling with an average elevation of 4,450 feet above sea level. The soil is sandy loam, with sagebrush and native grasses being the principal vegetation. Drainage is provided by numerous ravines and small creeks draining generally westerly.</p> <p>The mean magnetic variation is <math>18^{\circ} E.</math>, with no noticeable difference due to local attraction.</p>
