

TOWNSHIP 34 NORTH, RANGE 65 EAST, MDM, NEVADA

CHAINS

The following field notes are those of the retracement and partial reestablishment of a portion of the west boundary and the dependent resurvey of a portion of the north boundary and a portion of the subdivisional lines of Township 34 North, Range 65 East, Mount Diablo Meridian, Nevada.

The west boundary was surveyed by U.S. Deputy Surveyors John C. Snyles and Charles S. Preble, in 1880-81. The north boundary and a portion of the subdivisional lines were surveyed by U.S. Surveyor Newton E. Potter, in 1914. A portion of the west boundary was resurveyed by U.S. Surveyor Newton E. Potter, in 1914. The east boundary of T. 34 N., R. 64 E. was resurveyed concurrently under this same group.

The resurvey by Newton E. Potter is in fact about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile west and $\frac{1}{8}$ mile north of the survey executed by John C. Snyles and Charles S. Preble, resulting in major conflicts in private lands identified from the Snyles and Preble survey and the Potter resurvey.

The survey was executed in accordance with the specifications as set forth in the Manual of Surveying Instructions, 1973, the Special Instructions dated April 18, 1975, and supplemental Special Instructions dated September 23, 1976.

The direction of lines of this survey were determined by azimuth determined from BLM Tellurometer traverse stations. The lines were carried forward by sustained angulation.

Prior to restoration of corners, all necessary lines of the original survey were retraced and diligent search was made for any evidence of the original monuments and other calls of the official record. Identified corners were remonumented in their original positions, lost corners were reestablished by proportionate measurement based on the official record, but not until exhausting every reasonable possibility of finding direct evidence of the position of each corner.

The geographic position, determined from BLM Tellurometer traverse station established under Group No. 389, of the cor. of secs. 13, 18, 19 and 24, now an AM is at latitude $40^{\circ} 49' 16.378''$ N. and longitude $114^{\circ} 41' 02.430''$ W.

The mean magnetic declination is 17° east.
