## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The area resurveyed within Township 29 North, Range 33 East, varies from mountainous in the east portion to nearly level in the west portion. The elevation ranges from about 4,100 to 7,000 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from sandy clay and rocky on the higher elevations to sandy loam on the lower elevations. The vegetation consists of scattered juniper and pinon in the mountains and shadscale and sagebrush in the lower elevations.

The Southern Pacific Railroad and Interstate No. 80 bears NNE. and SSW., through the west two tiers of the township. The township is drained by the Humboldt River, course SSW., through the west tier of sections.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen and farmers. There has been mining activity in the mountains on the east side of the township.
