Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by E. H. Dyer, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, in 1863 and Completed by H. B. Maxson, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, in 1893, with a portion Retraced by William H. Craigue, U.S. Deputy Surveyor and Newton E. Potter, U.S. Transitman, in 1912.

From the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, on the S. bdy. of the Tp., monumented with a granite stone, 18x12x8 ins., plainly mkd. with 1 notch on the E. edge and 5 notches on the W. edge, firmly set in a collar of stone.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 6 ins. in the ground to bedrock and in a mound of stone to cap, 4 ft. base, with brass cap mkd.

40.17 The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 2 and 35, monumented with a granite stone, 16x12x8 ins., plainly mkd. ¼ on the N. face, firmly set in a collar of stone.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 6 ins. in the ground to bedrock and in a mound of stone to cap, 4½ ft. base, with brass cap mkd.
