GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 16 North, Range 65 East, ranges from about 7,600 to 9,600 ft. above sea level, and is mountainous. The soil is sandy clay, gravelly and rocky. The undergrowth consists of sagebrush and native grasses. The timber consists of juniper, pinon, mahogany, aspen, fir, spruce and bristlecone pine.

The township is drained by Steptoe Creek which winds southerly through the western portion of the township and Duck Creek which winds northerly through the western portion of the township, and other minor drainages.

Camp Success (Boy Scout Camp) is located in section 7 and there is an abandoned mining camp in section 8.

Access into the township is provided by the Duck Creek Road from the north and the Steptoe Creek Road from the south. Principal users of the area are cattlemen and sheepmen.
