

## TOWNSHIP 10 NORTH, RANGE 44 EAST, MDM, NEVADA

Other surveys remote to this area not given.		
Before restoring the corners, the lines of the original surveys were retraced and diligent search made for any evidence of the original corners and other calls of the original field note record.		
The rules of proportionate measurement and record bearings and distances were applied in order to ascertain the position of lost corners, after completing the necessary retracements to connect with the identified corner locations. In order to simplify the record, the true line notes only are supplied herewith, which refer to the completed resurvey.		
The survey was executed in accordance with the specifications as set forth in the Manual of Surveying Instructions, 1973, the Special Instructions dated June 4, 1975, and the supplemental Special Instructions dated June 24, 1975.		
The directions of lines were determined by means of fore and backsights and angular deflections from azimuths obtained from the U.S.G.S. Triangulation station "ROUND," located in sec. 19, T. 10 N., R. 44 E.		
The geographic position for the southeast corner of sec. 20, T. 10 N., R. 44 E., is at latitude $38^{\circ} 42' 14.2''$ N. and longitude $117^{\circ} 03' 16.3''$ W., as calculated from U.S.G.S. Triangulation station "ROUND" along section lines.		
The mean magnetic declination was found to be $16\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ east.

Reestablishment of a Portion of the Survey Executed by A.J. Hatch, D.H. Barker and E.L. Bridges, U.S. Deputy Surveyors, in 1873, and Resurveyed by Horace G. Parker, Cadastral Surveyor, in 1961.		
The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 25 and 30, T. 10 N., Rs. 43 and 44 E., monumented with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., exposed 4 ins. above ground, mkd. as described in the field notes of the resurvey of T. 10 N., R. 43 E., under Group No. 384.
